Dear Readers and Fellow Friars,

Once again the Christmas season approaches and with it the conclusion of yet another Greyfriars Press collection. Now we gird the editorial loins and prepare for the Spring 1974 programme. Our new Catalogue and Bond is enclosed for your (1) delectation, and (2) action - respectively.

The latest Bond does not present quite such a big price reduction as the August-December '73 List, but it is still a superb bargain offer by any comparative standards.

Due to escalating production costs we were forced to make an agonising choice between raising the cover price of our books to beyond the £3.00 threshold or making some small saving on our Privileged Order Bond prices. We chose the latter alternative as the most equitable solution to an extremely difficult dichotomy.

CAUTIONARY NOTE

It is calculated (quoting a recent article in The Bookseller) that production costs have risen a breathtaking 34% over the past two years; all of which HB have absorbed without passing on any part to its readers. Our reasons for rigid price maintenance are not simply altruistic; we believe that the Greyfriars-reading public at large will not be happy to pay more than the present tariff - at least, not in sufficient numbers to maintain the Imprint in a state of commercial viability.

We hope your response to our latest Bond offer will prove an overwhelming endorsement of our endeavour. Otherwise we may be forced seriously to consider the advisability of continuing our Greyfriars Press programme (as distinct from our general books) beyond the summer of 1974.

MAP BOOKMARK

We plan to produce a useful Bookmark in the form of a reduced-size Greyfriars Map (i.e., a reduced facsimile of our current Wall Map), in full colour of course, early in the New Year. This will be of the same dimensions as an average Magnet page, approximately 10" x 7". It should prove invaluable in marking your page-place as you read your way through each Magnet volume, while at the same time providing a constant and handy reference to geographical locations and features of the Greyfriars saga.
